

ENTRIES ARE INVITED FOR THE 13th ANNUAL MAVIS BATEY ESSAY PRIZE Closing date for submissions 8th May 2017



Our annual essay competition is intended to encourage vibrant, scholarly writing and new research, especially by those who have not yet had their work published. It is open to any student, worldwide, registered in a *bona-fide* university or institute of higher education, or who has recently graduated from such an institution.

Submissions must be 5,000 to 6,000 words and the only restriction on subject matter is that it must be of relevance to garden history. The prize includes an award of £250, free membership of **The Gardens Trust** for a year and consideration for publication in our peer-reviewed, scholarly journal *Garden History*. All previous winners have been accepted for publication, and often the best of the non-winning entries are invited to submit to the journal as well.

Rules for Submission 13th Annual Essay Prize 2017

Please read carefully: entries not conforming to the rules below will not be judged

The rules for submitting an essay are:

- 1) Authors should have *bona fide* student status at a university or other recognised institution of further education or have graduated from such an institution in 2016 or 2017.
- 2) The essay should be between 5,000 and 6,000 words in length, exclusive of endnotes, captions to illustrations and bibliography. Up to 8 illustrations may be included. Essays longer than the permitted word count will be returned without further consideration.
- 3) The essay should be set out in the format recommended by *Garden History*, the journal of The Gardens Trust, with a short [200-300 word] abstract and endnotes, plus a bibliography of works consulted. For format, see recent issues of *Garden History*, (don't worry about trying to match the font). *Garden History* is available on-line at JSTOR.
- 4) There are no restrictions on the subject matter except that it must be relevant to garden history.
- 5) Applicants from any country may apply, but submissions must be in English.
- 6) Applicants do not have to be members of The Gardens Trust.
- 7) The essay must be submitted in electronic format as a PDF (.pdf). No more than 2 files should be sent.
- 8) The prize will be judged anonymously so please do not write your name in the text. The application form (with name, address and proof of student status, i.e. scanned copy of student card) should be completed and attached separately to your email.

Other notes

The prize will consist of a cash sum of £250 plus free membership of The Gardens Trust for one year. (If the winner is already a member of The Gardens Trust, their subscription will be renewed for a year.) The winning entry will be considered for publication in *Garden History*. The judging panel will consist of the Editor of *Garden History* and members of The Gardens Trust's Education, Publications and Communications Committee, and other invited outside academics.
