As I hope you already know, you do not have to have a professional background in planning.

The knowledge of historic designed landscapes gathered by your CGT over time, by researching individual sites, gives you most of the tools you need to effectively respond to planning applications.

Particularly important in helping to protect unregistered sites.



Today, we have learnt from Margie that:

The Gardens Trust's Conservation Team relies on CGT local knowledge

Responses written by CGTs are vital



We learnt from Victoria...



Use *all* types of Designation to fight inappropriate development, not just historic designed landscape, but also other historic landscapes (eg battlefields), listed buildings, World Heritage Sites, AONB, ecology, archaeology, TPOs

Sites recognised as heritage assets receive some recognition and consideration

Statements of Significance help planners to quickly recognise key features

Round-Up

Involve yourselves in planning inquiries

• Develop a familiarity with key planning policies

• But most of all, value your specialist knowledge and understanding

• Consider how proposals could damage significance, both directly and indirectly (setting)





The GT can help you to build your planning response capacity in a number of ways...

Please encourage all your members to come along. Realise that some CGTs had assumed Meet Ups organised primarily for committee members, but they are a great way to inspire your ordinary members.

Upcoming Meet Ups planned for: Sheffield, July September 2018, in Warwick; November 2018, in Newcastle; January 2019, in Grantham (to include a presentation by the Woodland Trust); and March 2019, in Hampshire.
