Humphry Repton (1752-1818)

Humphry Repton was born in Suffolk in 1752 and attended Norwich Grammar School before training to be a textile merchant; a dominant trade in Norfolk at the time.

Following his marriage in 1773, Repton set up his own textile business. An unsuccessful merchant, he moved to Sustead, near Aylsham Norfolk, became a small landowner, and tried a succession of professions that all ended in failure: dramatist, artist, journalist, political agent and secretary.

Only when his long-time friend, James Edward Smith, introduced him to a career as a landscape gardener did Repton gain inspiration. He quickly combined his sketching flair and gardening skill to create unique landscape designs. As his designer career took off, he coined the phrase

'landscape gardening' to describe his activities. At Capability Brown's death, he succeeded him as leader of English landscape gardening.

Repton successfully cultivated his contacts amongst his fellow landed owners, to expand this business. Typical of his clients were the owners of Catton Park, Norfolk, his first paid commission. And many commissions to improve estates and parks followed, both in Norfolk, like Catton Hall, Sheringham Park and Hall, Hoveton Hall, Barningham Hall, Witton Hall, Northrepps Park, Holkham Hall, and further afield, including Tatton Park and Woburn Abbey. A talented artist, he produced detailed watercolour illustrations, many of which had lifting flaps to show 'before' and 'after' views. These images accompanied explanations for improving the client's garden and, when bound in red Moroccan leather, became known as 'Red Books'. Repton charged the client a fee for producing a 'Red Book', with many subsequently engaging him to carry out the work; although some of the four hundred plans never left the page.

> By the 1790s, Repton widened the business by introducing architectural design and construction as part of the package offered to clients. A successful departure, he initially collaborated with the up and coming architect John Nash, and subsequently with his sons, George Stanley and John Adey Repton. John was later to undertake a number of architectural projects in Britain and abroad.

Finally in 1818, after some years of disability, the result of a carriage accident, Repton was laid to rest at the Church of St Michael's and All Angels, Aylsham. At his request, he was buried in a prominent small garden plot by the church's chancel door. An impressive memorial stone was raised, that remains in situ. His wife Mary and fourth son William, who lived in Aylsham for many years, were buried in the same grave. His epitaph, written by Repton, reads:

"Not like Egyptian Tyrants consecrate Unmixed with others shall my dust remain But mold'ring, blending, melting into Earth. Mine shall give from and colour to the Rose And while its vivid colours cheer Mankind, Its perfumed odours shall ascend to Heaven."

As the home of Humphry Repton's first commission and last resting place, we are delighted to be hosting the biggest collection of events in the country for the Repton 200 Season here in Norfolk. A number of organisations, both local and national, have worked together on this exciting programme of events to celebrate the life and work of one of the country's greatest landscape gardeners.

Most events are taking place between March and June but there are some which carry on into the autumn, including the national Heritage Open Days festival. Everything in the programme connects to Repton's skills as a gardener, artist, dramatist and an important figure in Georgian history. Many artefacts, not normally available to view, will be on display at various events and rediscovered references will give an insight for Repton admirers of his work that might not have been seen before.

> There is something for everyone to enjoy at the Repton 200 Season and lots to learn about this important historical figure. While many

events are walk-in, some will require booking in advance - details can be found with each event listing.

We hope you enjoy exploring Norfolk and discovering Repton's legacy.



AYLSHAM PARISH CHURCH CAT

The Repton family had close links with Aylsham and St. Michael's Church during the 18th and 19th centuries. Humphry Repton's parents and sister are buried in the church, his eldest son, John Adey Repton, designed the altar screen, and another son, William, was church warden - following in the footsteps of his uncle, Humphry's brother in-law, John Adey. Humphry is buried in the churchyard, in a place he chose himself, surrounded by a bed of roses. The south aisle west window, depicting Christ with the Children, was added in 1855 in memory of Humphry and the Repton family. Open daily for all to enjoy.

BLICKLING HALL & CHURCH

There are a number of Repton family links with the Blickling Estate. Lady Caroline Suffield, of Blickling, approached Repton for advice for her nearby estate, Gunton Park. Repton painted 'Lady's Cottage in the Great Wood' on the Blickling estate c. 1780 (which is one of his earliest known watercolours) and his son, John Adey Repton, is known to have provided

designs for flower beds and garden structures. John Adey Repton also designed the Gothic Revival rood screen, separating the chancel from the nave, in nearby



Blickling Parish Church c.1825.

CATTON PARK

Catton Park is a 70 acre country park on the northern outskirts of Norwich. It has special significance as it was the first commission of Humphry Repton as a landscape gardener. Visitors can wander through the open wild flower meadow or explore the woodland with its many interesting trees and wood sculptures. There are footpaths through the woods and across the park; most of which are accessible by wheelchairs and push-chairs. Open for all to enjoy at any time.

FELBRIGG HALL

Repton regularly used the library at Felbrigg when he lived at nearby Sustead. William Windham, the owner of the estate, employed Repton



as his political secretary, supported his studies of agriculture and botany, and provided him

with introductions to learned men, including Sir Joseph Banks, some of which helped Repton to secure his first commissions. Although there is no record of a 'Red Book' ever having been produced for Felbrigg, he completed annotated sketches of the estate and significant landscaping, 'Reptonian' in character, was carried out on the estate during Repton's time.

HOLKHAM HALL



Humphry Repton produced his first 'Red Book' for the park at Holkham in 1789. Thomas William Coke (later Earl of Leicester) had inherited Holkham in 1776 and commissioned Repton to reimagine the pleasure grounds around the lake. Account books suggest that at least some of Repton's proposals were fulfilled and Repton himself claimed that the walks, at least, had been constructed. Holkham Park open daily from 25 March to 21 December 2018, 9am to 5pm (10am-4pm in November and December).

HOVETON HALL GARDENS

The Hoveton Hall Estate covers 620 acres or parkland, gardens, woodland, arable and grazing agricultural land and a fine Regency Hall built between 1809-1812 whose design is attributed to Humphry Repton and his son. The parkland surrounding the Hall was ploughed in the 1940's to provide food during the war years. Most trees were removed and only the grass on the North side of the lake left untouched.

The gardens are open from 30 March to 30 September, 10.30am - 5pm every day except Saturdays.

NORTHREPPS COTTAGE & FOREST PARK

In 1792 Repton compiled a 'Red Book' for Bartlett Gurney, including suggestions for a new hall within a landscaped park. The proposed hall, positioned on a hill overlooking Northrepps village, was not built due to being considered too ostentatious by the Quaker family. Instead, a more humble cottage, by William Wilkins of Norwich with input from Humphry Repton, was built a year



later in the valley of the same hill. Many of Repton's proposals for

planting trees were carried out. Still in Gurney ownership, Northrepps Cottage is now a country hotel where visitors can relax in the elegant Humphry's Bar and enjoy fine dining in Repton's Restaurant. Neighbouring Forest Park, also run by the family, is an award-winning holiday park.

Repton named the commission for Sheringham Park in north Norfolk in 1812 as his "most favourite work." It is widely regarded as being among his finest works and as the best surviving example of his designs on the ground.

THE YURT A BURLINCHAM HALL

Burlingham Hall, together with Hoveton Hall, was owned by the Burroughes family at the time of Humphry Repton's Norfolk commissions and though the 'big house' is gone, the walled garden at Burlingham still contains the somewhat ravaged elaborate trellis-work gate known as Repton's Gate.




