



The Parks and Gardens UK database (https://www.parksandgardens.org/) is a freely accessible online database, with records of nearly 10000 historic designed landscapes, along with more than 2400 biographies of associated people and organisations.

In 2016, the charity, Hestercombe Gardens Trust, Somerset, received Lottery funding to take on PGUK and modernise the database so that the archive can continue to grow. The database and updated website were relaunched in 2019 and are once again ready to receive data from parks and gardens researchers.

There are several ways you can look for records of parks and gardens. You can search for a site by name or map view, or type. Or you can select a person, such as an owner or designer, to find out which landscapes they were associated with.



A thumbnail entry for the site takes you on to a fuller description, which includes the entry from Historic England's 'Register of Parks and Gardens of Special Historic Interest', if the landscape is Registered. PGUK also holds entries for non-designated historic designed landscapes, so is a useful platform for championing these sometimes overlooked sites.
