Land of the Fanns: The Know It, Love It Project

Use this checklist to list the features you want to look for when you are on-site, and then to add comments whilst on-site.

Start by listing the names of things you hope to find in the feature column before you start on site, based on the document research you have already done. That way you will not forget any of them once you are there.

When you are on site, you can add detail on what you find of the features: Their location, appearance, size, orientation, what they are made of, and how well they survive: i.e. complete survival, lost; reconstructed or inaccessible. Make an estimate of the historic period features survive from. Check it off when you have done each one.

Feature	Checke
For example: Dovecote Located 20m northwest of stable block. Circular building 5metres tall; Diameter 5.5 metres. Old (narrow) looking red brick, lime mortar, English bonding. two rectangular (portrait) windows to west and east. doorway but no door. roof gone apart from a few timbers. floor covered in rubble. brickwork in poor condition but evidence of previous repairs to top of walls. Evidence of pigeon housing in timber around walls and an old stair. Serves as an eyecatcher in views from the main drive; on bank 10m high above the service road to the house, backed by northern shelterbelt 15m to the rear
