#### Active Participation

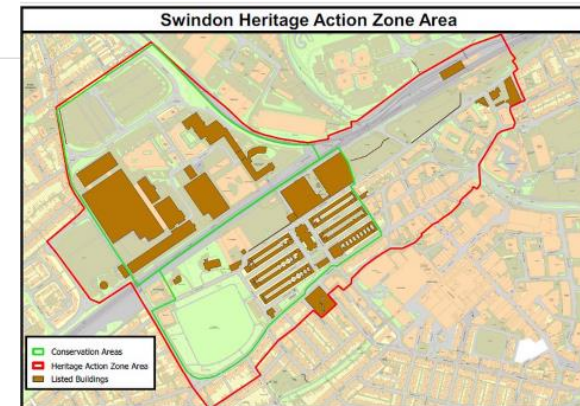
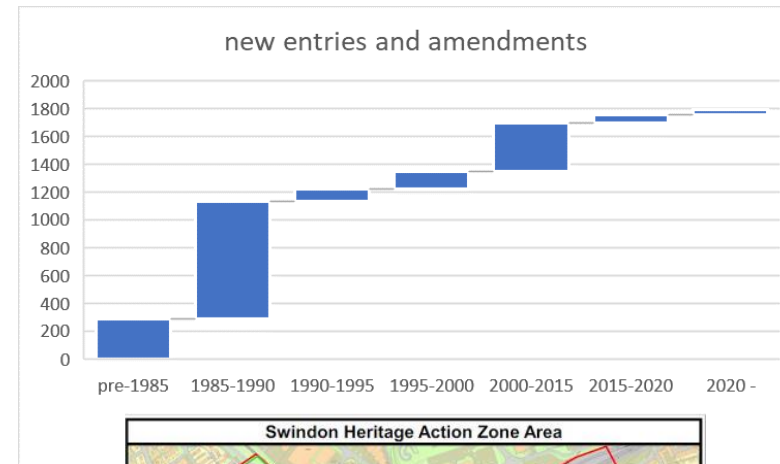
We will inspire and equip people to take action in support of the places they care about.

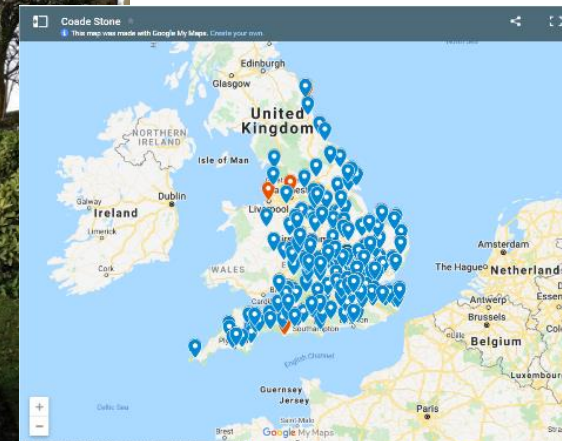
