#### GEORGIAN GROUP JOURNAL

The Georgian Group Journal is the authoritative journal of record for early modern architecture in Britain between 1660 and 1840 and was first published in 1986. It is cited more often than any other title in Sir Howard Colvin's classic work of reference A Biographical Dictionary of British Architects 1600-1840 and is essential reading for anyone interested in architecture and related aspects of material culture during this period.

The Georgian Group Journal, published annually, is sent to all members and subscribing libraries. It is currently edited by Dr. Geoffrey Tyack of Oxford University. Previous editors have included: Roger White, Giles Worsley and Richard Hewlings.



#### William Nesfield: soldier, artist & landscape designer

There can't be many great landscape gardeners who, as a young man, fought against Napoleon in the Peninsular War or against the Americans in the War of 1812. Yet one who did both went on to become a well-known artist and then one of the leading garden designers of the 19thc, with over 250 sites including some of the most important in the country under his belt by the time he died in 1881.

He was William Andrews Nesfield usually mainly remembered for his complicated colourful geometric parterres but who was actually a far more nuanced and sophisticated designer than he is







Scott's Grotto in Ware, Hertfordshire is a Grade 1 listed building and with six chambers it is the most extensive shell grotto in the United Kingdom.






Robert Frewer's garden in St James Place, Norwich.
